From the Coach:

Every year is different from all others. Perhaps this is one of the things that make coaching interesting at the collegiate level. In fact, every season is different when we have a sport like sailing that is a two-season sport. Our team this Fall was one of our best. Throughout the season we saw improvement with nearly all team members and our 8th place finish at the SAISA/MAISA in Charleston was probably our best showing. The team that represented us there all sailed their season's best. Everyone on the team was a contributor and all but one member of the team sailed in at least one event. Our freshmen are developing well and Mark Newman will see more sailing time with the departure of Justin Ailsworth who has used up his eligibility. Dan Heely is already one of our better crews. But this wasn't a year for the individual; it was a year of the *team*. The level of cooperation between members, the willingness to work to better our home events and the skill development of each member were the hallmarks of this team. Traveling with this group was a true pleasure and the manner in which all represented the university was exceptional.

We expect to lose only Justin (who will be the team manager for the spring) and we will be adding several new people for whom we have high expectations. A juggling of the MAISA schedule will give us several new events and moves the CNU Open to a more desirable, late spring date. So, we have little doubt that our excellent Fall will be followed by an even better Spring.
