From the Coach:

We are all aware of the tremendous changes taking place at Christopher Newport. These changes have also impacted the Sailing Team. When our school was a “commuter college” with no on-campus residents, most of our team were local kids who couldn’t go away to school. At that time the academic requirements were such that most applicants could gain admission. All that has changed. The majority of our teams from years past would find it difficult to gain admission. More of our students are from outside the area and this has all had an effect on where we find our potential team members and whom we are able to recruit.

Over the last three years the team has been taking on a new character, defined by the sharper, more academically capable students the university is now attracting. These new team members aren’t coming to campus as better sailors. The very best of the high school sailors continue to concentrate at the top sailing schools. But these new members are more committed to their team, their academics and their fellow team members. What they lack in proven sailing skills, they make up for with commitment, intelligence and a positive team attitude.

Of particular note this spring is that we sailed our best event at the Leroy Grant regatta, the final event of the season. Mark Newman, Paula Davis, Pete Foytik and Rebecca Casey all came through with their best effort. Their on-the-water decisions were seldom wrong and their reading of the wind shifts was clearly much improved.

Perhaps the best news for the team, as we look toward the fall, is that we expect everyone back next semester and one other former member should be back after taking a semester to concentrate on academics. At this point we have three good

prospects for the fall admitted and committed to the university. We have five others from whom we are awaiting a commitment or a final decision on their admittance. This is the largest returning group we have ever had and with the addition of some quality people, next year’s team will be a good one.

I do want to emphasize one thing. Our sailors are true “student/athletes.” None of them came the CNU just to sail. As competitive people, they want to win and they want to become better sailors. They also know they are in school for an education. But there is another most important goal we have for the team. We want their collegiate sailing to be one of the most positive experiences of their college years. With the group we have returning, I have no doubt that it will be.

I do want to thank Jim White, our assistant coach and Justin Ailsworth, our team manager and former team captain for all their hard work. Their contributions were of major importance. And, to all of those people who have given of their time and money to help make our team all that it is, thank you. I can assure you that there is no group more deserving of your generosity than the CNU Sailing Team.
